
NEW COUNCILLOR

Gavin joined Newbald Parish Council (NPC) in September 2010. He cited his reason as being his determination to protect the village from adverse change and his desire to nurture the village's community spirit. He was already a very active member of the village at that point, including being on the Village Hall Management Committee.



Gavin quickly became a very key and vocal member of the council and was elected as Vice Chairman at the Annual Meeting of May 2012.

He had very strong opinions and was incredibly protective of the village. He was never afraid to voice his thoughts firmly and defiantly. Here is an extract from our March 2013 newsletter, in Gavin's own words, which he insisted on including and putting his name to personally. (This was unusual, as normally all articles in the newsletter are written by the Clerk on behalf of the whole council.)

"You Know Who You Are!!

As a responsible dog owner and resident of this wonderful village, I am unreservedly disgusted at the continual disregard for

other parishioners by the few unabashed dog owners who cannot be bothered to clear up after their animals.

Our pavements and grass verges are fast becoming an unacceptable 'dog dumping' ground, the products of which are often carried unsuspecting into homes via children and elders alike, many of whom do not even have a dog. We are also experiencing those who unbelievably make the effort to pick up after their dog, only to throw the bag and its contents into the hedge bottom how clever is that!

As a Parish Council we have provided more than adequate number of waste bins, strategically positioned around the village for easy disposal of the offending 'packets', but still people refuse to adhere to the wishes of the many, to the point where I have even seen piles within feet of the bins.

With the above in mind, I am personally of the opinion that people with this attitude to dog fouling should either not be allowed to have a dog or simply not be resident in our village with such a selfish attitude for others.

In Conclusion: To those like myself who love and respect our village, I sincerely thank you for all your efforts, and to those who continually ignore other Parishioners clean living wishes, I truly hope you find your conscience very quickly, for all of our sakes". Gavin M Steward, Vice Chairman.

This was the first of other such articles by Gavin, which followed in subsequent newsletters.

In 2013, when the Parish Council wanted to create a stone memorial bench on the Green to commemorate 100 years since the start of the first world war and the opening of the new Newbald School, it was Gavin who designed it. The memorial bench, which went on to be built in 2014 and still graces the Green, is testament to his artistic and design skills. He also helped John Danby to build it in person.

Always a natural leader, Gavin was appointed as Chairman of NPC on 18 May 2015. True to his nature, he was quick to persuade other councillors to sweep away the bureaucracy of the existing committee structure and simplify the operation of the Parish Council.

As Gavin put it in 2016, "When I took the Chair in May 2015, we were having 30+ meetings per year. This year we have restricted our meetings to one per month, whilst still covering the same workload. This is in itself an achievement, demonstrating that your councillors are working diligently and efficiently on your behalf to resolve matters."

Gavin never liked red tape and bureaucracy, preferring to just get things done!

Gavin played a key part in securing the Sober Hill Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund on behalf of the village, which was by no means guaranteed. Sober Hill Wind Farm Ltd were not legally obligated to give money to Newbald, they had to be persuaded to do so. The fund has given good causes in the village an income of £26,000+ each year and is managed by NPC.

As the Newbald representative, Gavin also fought hard to make sure that Newbald received its fair share of the Sancton Hill Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund. It should be said that this was done in the face of considerable opposition from some other panel members, who felt that Newbald applicants should not receive anything due to having access to the Sober fund.

In his era, NPC became very environmentally conscious, planting trees throughout the village, creating a bee friendly zone and replacing old benches with environmentally friendly ones. This scheme is ongoing and will roll out in the future years, as our budget allows. Gavin worked with his colleague, Cllr. John Howard, and consultants to carry out a feasibility study to see if Newbald could benefit from a Community Renewable Energy Scheme, which would see the village owning its own wind turbine to meet its energy needs. While unfortunately this proved to currently not be viable, due to the upgrades needed to the national electricity grid, the groundwork has been done and a foundation laid for this in the future.



With Gavin at the helm, and after many years of campaigning and liasing with KCOM, NPC secured superfast broadband for residents who were previously stuck with incredibly slow broadband speeds.



Gavin campaigned tirelessly for improved road safety and to protect the village from unwelcome planning developments. He was often incredibly frustrated by the UK planning system and ERYC's policies, which often made NPC feel that its requests, comments and appeals fell on deaf ears. However, this never curbed his enthusiasm, nor stopped him from working hard to find solutions. He provided practical help in many ways, including cemetery and churchyard safety inspections, beck inspections and meeting with contractors. He attended countless meetings on the parish's behalf. He was always happy to act as the intermediary between NPC, residents and other parties where necessary and was amazingly diplomatic, persuasive and capable of making all parties happy, whilst always keeping Newbald's needs front and centre.

He knew Newbald and its inhabitants so well. His wealth of knowledge of the local area and local inter-connections of people was amazing. He was perhaps the most qualified person to serve the village of Newbald on the Parish Council.



He was like a walking encyclopaedia of Newbald. He could tell you the local history, who knew who, who owned what and what had happened previously. He could put any local happening quickly into a context, which made everything easier to understand.

He had an amazing ability to unite people, to make everyone feel valued, heard, and understood. That was true of councillors and parishioners alike. He was very influential, such that you had the feeling that without him things would just not be the same. Indeed, many Members of the Council threatened to leave if he left the Parish Council. As it is, losing him in this incredibly sad way, has made us all determined to carry on and serve the Parish Council in his memory.

If this reflection on Gavin has taken longer than the 2 minutes, he would restrict members' speeches to, we are sorry, but there are far too many positive things that we would not want to leave out!

In memory of Gavin, NPC intends to put a new environmentally friendly bench, complete with memorial plaque, under the lime trees next to the Green. We feel this will be a fitting tribute to our friend and colleague.

SAFETY MEASURES AND RENOVATIONS AT HALL



The last few months have seen the Village Hall attracting a lot of party bookings as life has returned to a semblance of normality. Newbald Village Hall However, some regular classes have been lost as numbers haven't been sufficient to support them... it seems there may still be a little

bit of work to be done regarding people's confidence. For our part, we have applied for funding for high grade air purification for both the main hall and community room which will allow faster turnaround between bookings and largely eliminate the need to open windows and doors to ventilate the rooms, obviously a major factor at this time of year.
