NEW NEWBALD COUNCILLORS

NPC has welcomed two new councillors on board. Dave Blamires and Jenny Platt have already brought a lot of energy to the role.

Relatively new to the village, Dave immediately found it to be a friendly and welcoming community. Prior to moving here, he helped with village events and worked with the parish council on various issues. He is pleased to be able to continue with that as a parish councillor in Newbald. NPC continues to hear from residents troubled by speeding traffic and inappropriate parking. Councillors too are concerned about the dangers to road users and pedestrians. As we have reported before, East Riding of Yorkshire Council (ERYC) considers Newbald to be very safe. Nobody has died on our roads. Therefore, in these cash-strapped times, we are a

very low priority. However, thanks to our campaigning, Newbald is now one of very few places in the East Riding where ERYC is coming to do a site survey and review its previous decision not to provide traffic calming measures. We will make the most of this opportunity to fight for change. Meanwhile, NPC continues to be at the forefront of a drive to

encourage ERYC to pay more attention to the opinions of town and parish councils in planning and all other matters. We do not currently feel listened to in the way that we should be, given we are the government body closest to the public. We understand our parishes better than ERYC. We are consulting with other councils and will update you.

We have noticed many cars being parked on the paving stones on Co-op corner (Galegate/Eastgate). We would like to request that you refrain from doing this. The pavers are not strong enough to cope with the weight of cars, and there has also been some damage done to the planted areas.

REMOVE THE ROAD THAT CROSSES THE GREEN?



If residents approve, NPC may assess the feasibility of removing the wider of the two diagonal roads across the Green. This road, which is often used as a cut-through, can be dangerous, particularly where it meets the blind junction at Burgate. Drivers

take it at too high a speed. Without it, we would have a larger expanse of grass and the Green would feel less cluttered. However, some parking would be lost. Though expensive, we could raise money via the Sober Hill Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund and hopefully other grants.

We will not embark on this long-term project unless a significant number of residents tell us that it is important to them. **So, please let us know your thoughts. You can fill in the form on our website** or contact us another way.

Newbald Parish Council is working with local landowners, West Wolds Slow the Flow, the University of Hull Flood Innovation Centre and the flood risk agencies, to review opportunities for Natural Flood Management around Newbald. This is to notify you that the University will be carrying out a drone-based survey, some time between June and July 2022, weather permitting, to provide a detailed topographical map along the corridor of the Newbald beck. This will be carried out with all appropriate Civil Aviation, technical and safety checks in place.
