NEW JUBILEE TREES

As part of the commemoration of the Platinum Jubilee, NPC intends to plant two Snow Fountain Cherry Blossom Trees. One will be on the Highways grass in front of the Church railings, the other at the corner of the A1034 and Westgate. The proposed locations are dependent on ERYC approval. ERYC is currently considering our request but we are optimistic about the outcome.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN?

We are currently exploring whether or not to create a Neighbourhood Plan Newbald. This is one way we influence planning applications that come up for our area. The plan would involve extensive consultation with residents and would culminate in a final document detailing a shared vision for our neighbourhood. The plan would cover such things as the preferred type and extent of housing, businesses and any other potential developments. It would also detail what aspects of the area we are determined to protect.

Needless to say, any such project will take a long time, involve a lot of work, and be very expensive. However, there are many grants available to help, as the Government is strongly encouraging such plans.

The final plan would be a 'statutory material planning consideration' that ERYC would be compelled to take into account. That said, they are not duty bound to stick within its limits if they feel they have strong enough reasons not to. KEEPING THE BECK CLEAR - VOLUNTEER GROUP

The sewage leaks and flooding of recent years have cast a spotlight on measures that need to be taken to try and prevent such problems in the future. One thing that really would help is to ensure that the beck is flowing freely and not obstructed by weeds. While NPC does employ the Yorkshire Wildlife Trust (YWT) to do some clearance work at The Mires annually, more frequent clearing is becoming necessary as the rate of growth of weed and vegetation speeds up year on year.

The organisation West Wolds Slow The Flow (WWSTF) is a collaborative organisation working with parish councils, ERYC, YWT, Yorkshire Water, Hull University and the Environment Agency to find natural ways to slow down the flow of the beck in the West Wolds area, so helping to prevent future flooding. This group has offered to train volunteers in how to carry out the clearance work. We are still at the early stages of establishing this group. If you are interested in being involved in this very interesting and worthwhile project, please get in touch.

Scientists from Hull University and WWSTF have reached an agreement to set up a time lapse camera in Newbald to observe the flow of the beck over time to inform future decisions. WWSTF is consulting with landowners about how they may help with the slow the flow initiative.

POLITE REQUEST -PLEASE DON'T TAKE VATER FROM THE BECI



After the long periods of dry weather recently, we have noticed that the levels of water in the beck are particularly low. We are concerned at how this may be impacting on the wildlife habitats it supports.

We would therefore be very grateful if residents could refrain from using beck water to water their gardens. While in normal times this may seem like a better option than tap water, in a time of drought like this, we need to do all we can to protect the beck and its flora and fauna. Thank you.

It certainly makes a change from the flood risks we are used to!


